While renewal of the KYEMSC Voluntary EMS Pediatric Recognition Program only requires one example of pediatric outreach, ██████████ EMS is heavily involved in various activities that meet the requirement. The attached list gives a representative example of some of these events, which included tours, instruction on providing first aid, calling 911, supporting children considering health career careers or education, injury risk reduction and a host of others. Many other activities are also available but have been omitted for the sake of brevity.

Plans for the coming year are varied. Most of our on-site tours and tours that we travel to are arranged within a month or two of delivery by the requestor, so those aren't available to pre-plan well in advance. When such a request is made it is transferred via email to a designated group to arrange for coverage. That may be in the form of an on-duty crew or- if the request includes delivery of more in-depth information- an assigned PR person/educator.

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██████████ has become an active participant with the ██████████ County School's Safety Committee, offering advice and expertise on a number of topics such as equipment review, training, and policy development. This past year EMS taught all school system administrators the "Stop the Bleed" program and provided them the opportunity to build delivery of the course into their individual school staff meeting free-of-charge. EMS and ██████████'s Environmental Health and Safety Department have begun working together to investigate equipment options for the county schools, with future plans for expansion to city schools as well.

About one month ahead of time, our parent company's PR/Marketing Department looks at upcoming events and tailors some activities towards them. These events may be related to the season (such as risk of heat stroke in the summer), a current event (such as infants left unattended in hot cars), or a nationally recognized day (like one for safe biking or injury prevention). An EMS staff member is regularly available to appear in TV and radio news segments to discuss prevention, emergency care and health concerns related to these developed topics.
